Belgian Comics is a traveling exhibition that offers visitors a unique opportunity to admire twenty reproductions of artworks by Belgian comic book artists. Featuring a wide range of graphic styles, the collection highlights the creativity, diversity, and cultural richness of Belgian comics, both French-speaking and Dutch-speaking.

RECOMMENDED AGE: 10 and up

CONTENT:

22 pannels (40 x 60cm) :

- 1 poster
- 1 introduction
- 20 reproductions of artwork with captions
- A space of **13.5 linear metres minimum** is required.
- The panels are designed to be printed on rigid materials (such as 3mm-thick Forex with no framing required), or on heavyweight framed paper.

PLEASE NOTE: the customer is solely responsible for printing, setting up, and dismantling the exhibition.

LANGUAGES:

English, French and Dutch.

Comic Art & Art Nouveau

Art Nouveau seen through the lens of comic book artists!

Under the banner of Art Nouveau and comics, this exhibition explores the richness of the 9th Art and some of its key figures. This journey through time recreates a prosperous Belle Époque, with its department stores and major inventions such as the cinematograph.

Comic Art & Art Nouveau captures the dynamic spirit of that era, highlighting an art form that has influenced generations of comic book artists. Each has reinterpreted Art Nouveau in their own unique way, producing works that are bold, rhythmic, vibrant, and extraordinarily imaginative.

RECOMMENDED AGE: 12 and up

CONTENT:

- **24 panels** (50 x 70cm)
(1 poster + 1 introduction + 22 reproductions of artwork with captions)
- A space of **16 linear metres minimum** is required.
- The panels are designed to be printed on rigid materials (such as 3mm-thick Forex with no framing required), or on heavyweight framed paper.

PLEASE NOTE: the customer is solely responsible for printing, setting up, and dismantling the exhibition.

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The Comics Lab

How to make your own comic book!

The Comics Lab travelling exhibition is an engaging and educational experience tailored for children ages 6 to 10. It offers an opportunity to discover the fascinating world of comics, unveiling their visual language, creative processes, and the book production chain. Through original illustrations by Belgian author Karolina Szejda (creator of *Tram 5* and *Love Me Tinder*), children will also explore the various genres within comics, immersing themselves in the richness of this dynamic art form.

Interactive games are integrated into the panels, offering children the opportunity to actively participate in the exhibition. These games are designed to reinforce the understanding of the concepts covered and stimulate visitor engagement. **The Comics Lab** takes visitors on a captivating journey accompanied by two friendly characters.



RECOMMENDED AGE: 6 to 10

CONTENT:

- **7 pannels** (50 x 70cm)
- The panels are designed to be printed on rigid materials (such as 3mm-thick Forex with no framing required), or on heavyweight framed paper.
- A space of **4.7 linear metres minimum** is required.
- An **activity booklet** to be printed on regular A4 paper.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** the customer is solely responsible for printing, setting up, and dismantling the exhibition.

AVAILABLE LANGUAGES:

English, French or Dutch

ACTIVITY BOOKLET:

This travelling comic exhibition includes an activity booklet, featuring additional learning activities and suggestions for enhancing children's understanding of the material covered.

Zorah

A live drawing concert !

In 2022, Dargaud published *Tanger sous la pluie* [*Tangier in the Rain*] by Fabien Grolleau and Abdel de Bruxelles. This graphic novel reimagined painter Henri Matisse's 1912 stay in Tangier. Trapped indoors by rain, Matisse summoned Zorah, a young woman, to pose for him.

Our show **Zorah** spins off from this graphic novel as a live drawing concert. Through Abdel de Bruxelles' expressive lines, Malika El Barkani's original soundtrack, and animated sequences by Lila Bouzbiba and Camille Le Marcis, the show explores Zorah's harsh daily life and her longing for elsewhere in a visually and musically immersive performance.

RECOMMENDED AGE: 10 and up

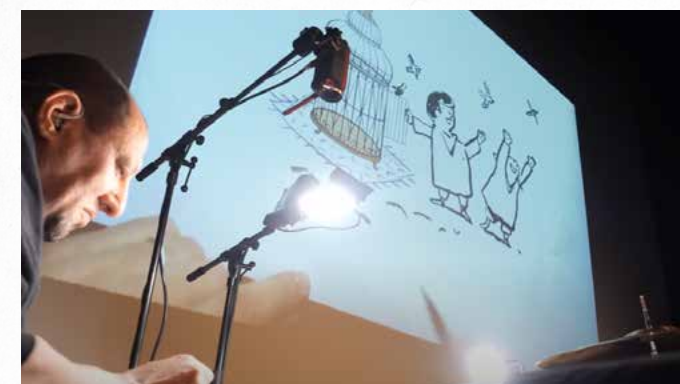
RUNTIME:

- 45 minutes

PERFORMANCE & PERFORMERS:

- 2 performers on stage — Abdel de Bruxelles (live drawing) and Malika El Barkani (live music)
- A projected live drawing performance
- Projected animated sequences
- An original soundtrack (part live concert, part prerecorded)
- The performance requires an indoor area and access to electricity.

EQUIPMENT:

The artists will bring their own instruments and part of the required equipment. The venue must provide the remaining equipment. A technical rider will be provided during the booking process.

LIVE DRAWING:

As its name suggests, a live drawing is simply an artist drawing in real time.

In this performance, Abdel de Bruxelles' work is projected onto a screen, allowing the audience to see his illustrations unfold in detail to the sound of Malika El Barkani's guitar.

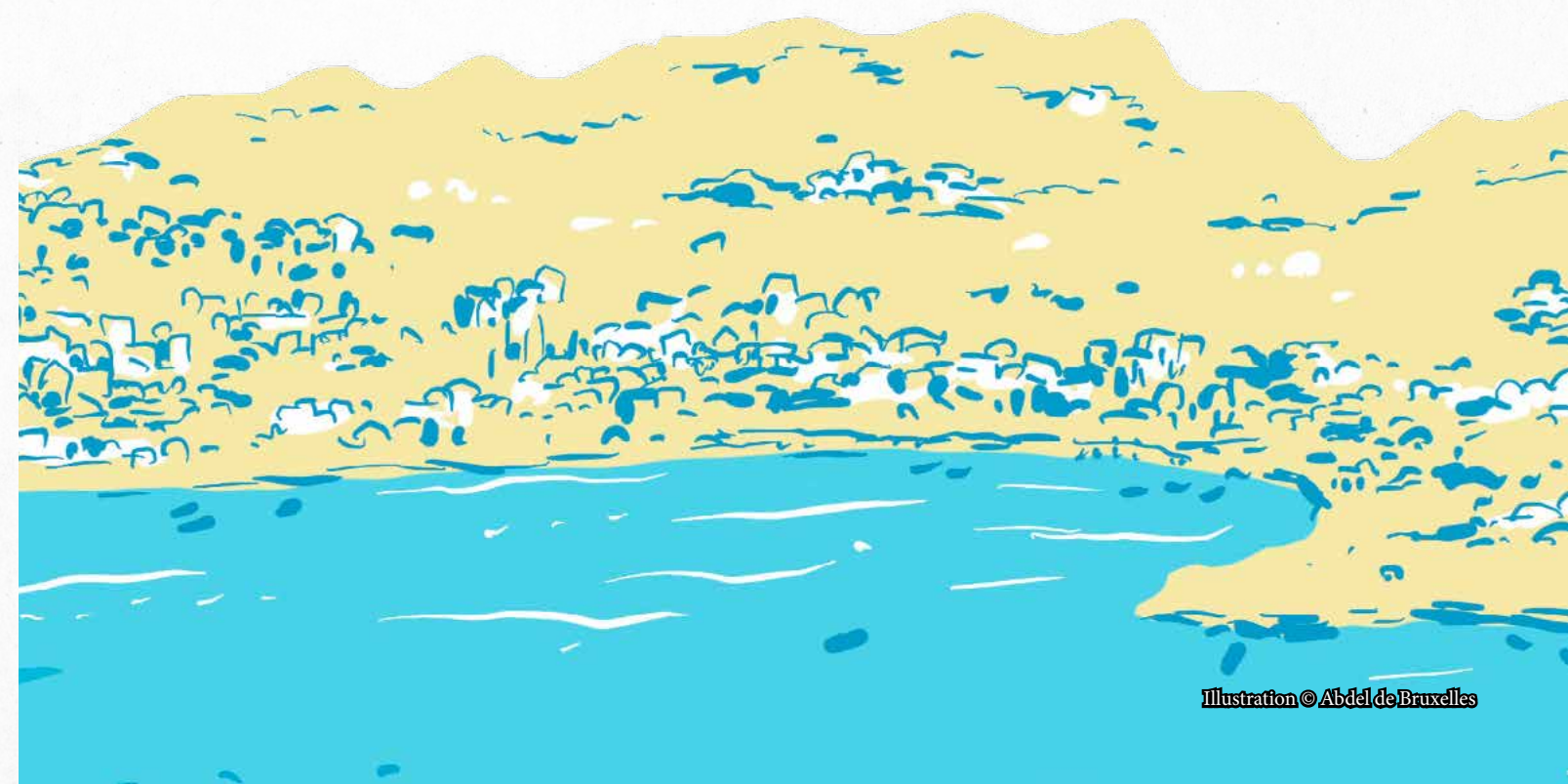

Booking

When contacting us by email with your request, please remember to inform us of the **exact dates** on which you wish to exhibit, as well as the **exhibition venues**.

We will then send you a written **quotation**, which you should return to us signed if the offer suits you. A **rental agreement** will then be sent to you, which must also be signed and returned. And that's it — your booking will be confirmed!

CHANGES

Any changes will incur additional costs, whether they involve translations or design adjustments. Such changes may also result in additional lead time for the delivery of the exhibition.

PRINTING

Printing is always the responsibility of the client. We generally recommend rigid materials, such as 3 mm thick Forex. However, printing on high-weight paper is also possible, provided that the prints are subsequently framed.
